ENACTMENT BILL – S.18-E-008



*Regarding the updates to the Co-Sponsorship Criteria.*

1. **Whereas** the Undergraduate Student Government Bylaws require the Co-Sponsorship Criteria to be approved by the Undergraduate Student Government, and
2. **Whereas** these questions and criteria will be a tool for Senate to determine whether or not the Undergraduate Student Government should co-sponsor an event.
3. **Therefore be it enacted** that the following becomes the Co-Sponsorship Criteria for the Undergraduate Student Government:

*Funding Criteria Checklist*

- *How is the presenting organization funded? (i.e. UFB, SACUB, etc.)*
  - *If organization is funded by another part of USG, organization is ineligible for co-sponsorship from Undergraduate Student Government (USG) at-large.*
- *Is the goal of the organization to raise funds for a third party (charity/nonprofit)?*
  - *USG funds are not permitted to go directly towards nonprofit/3rd party organizations, but USG funds may be used to promote and put on events benefiting nonprofit/3rd party organizations.*
- *What is the total budget the organization has for the event, program, activity, etc.?*
  - *What is the breakdown of funds for the event?*
  - *Where will the USG funds being requested be used in context to total budget for the event?*
- *How does this co-sponsorship directly or indirectly affect the student body?*
  - *What percentage (or number) of University of Cincinnati students will benefit from this event taking place?*
- *Why is the group/organization in question specifically asking USG for funding?*
  - *Have appropriate university offices and other organizations within and outside the University of Cincinnati been reached out to for funding?*
